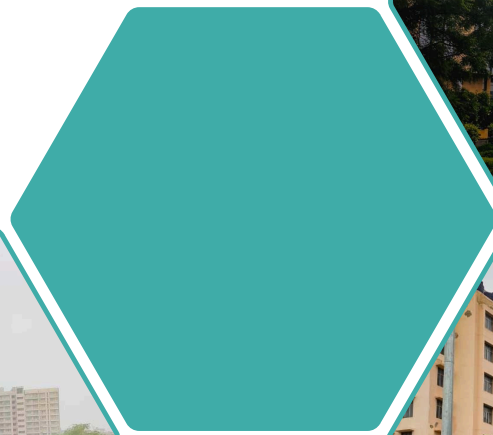

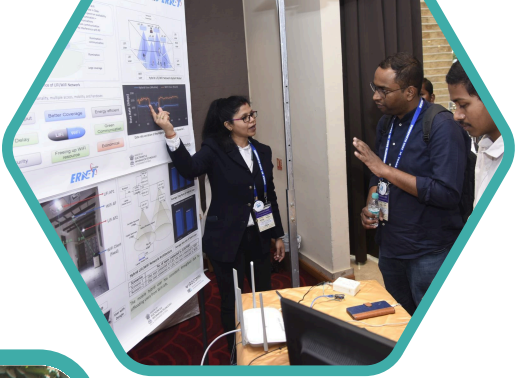


About IIITD

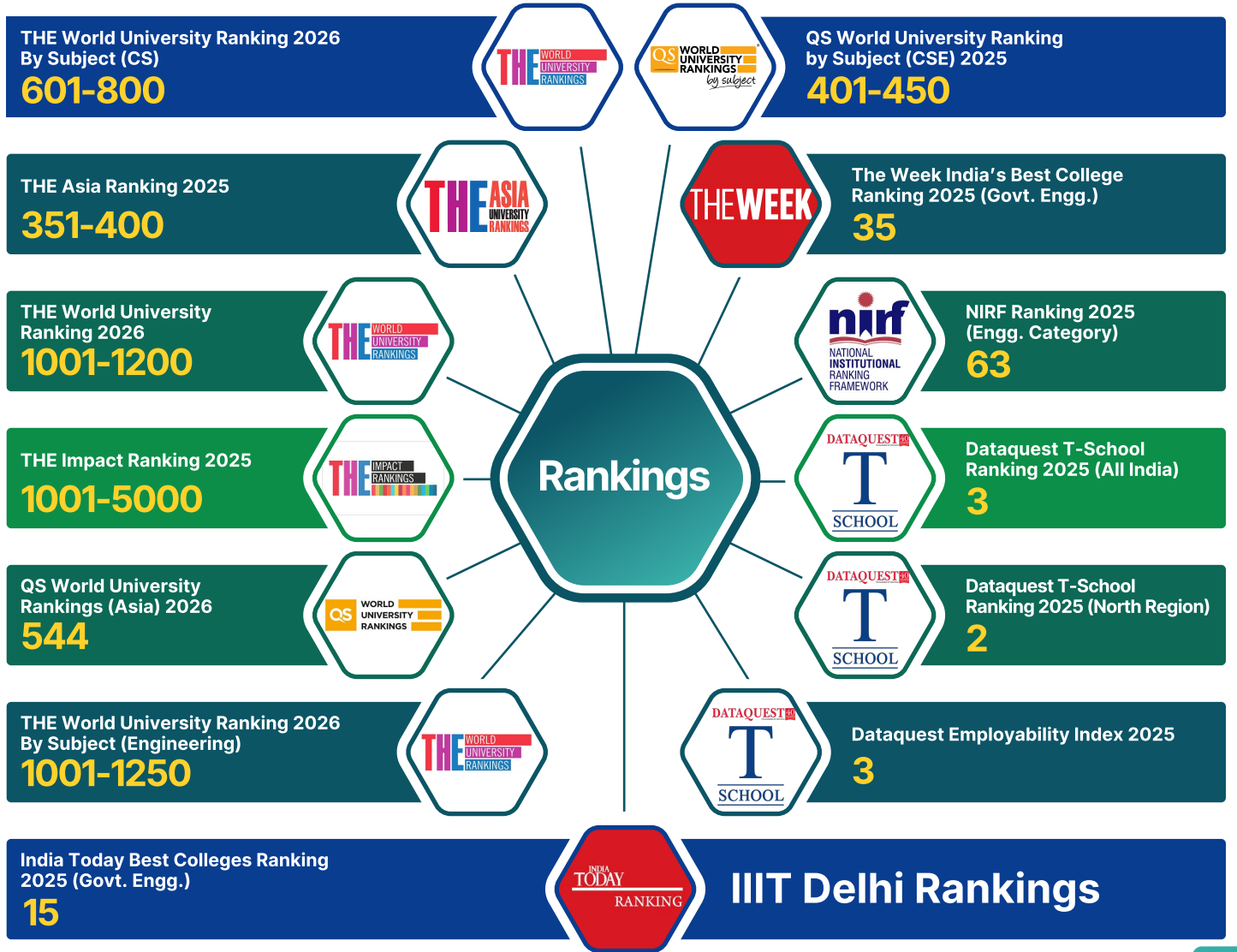

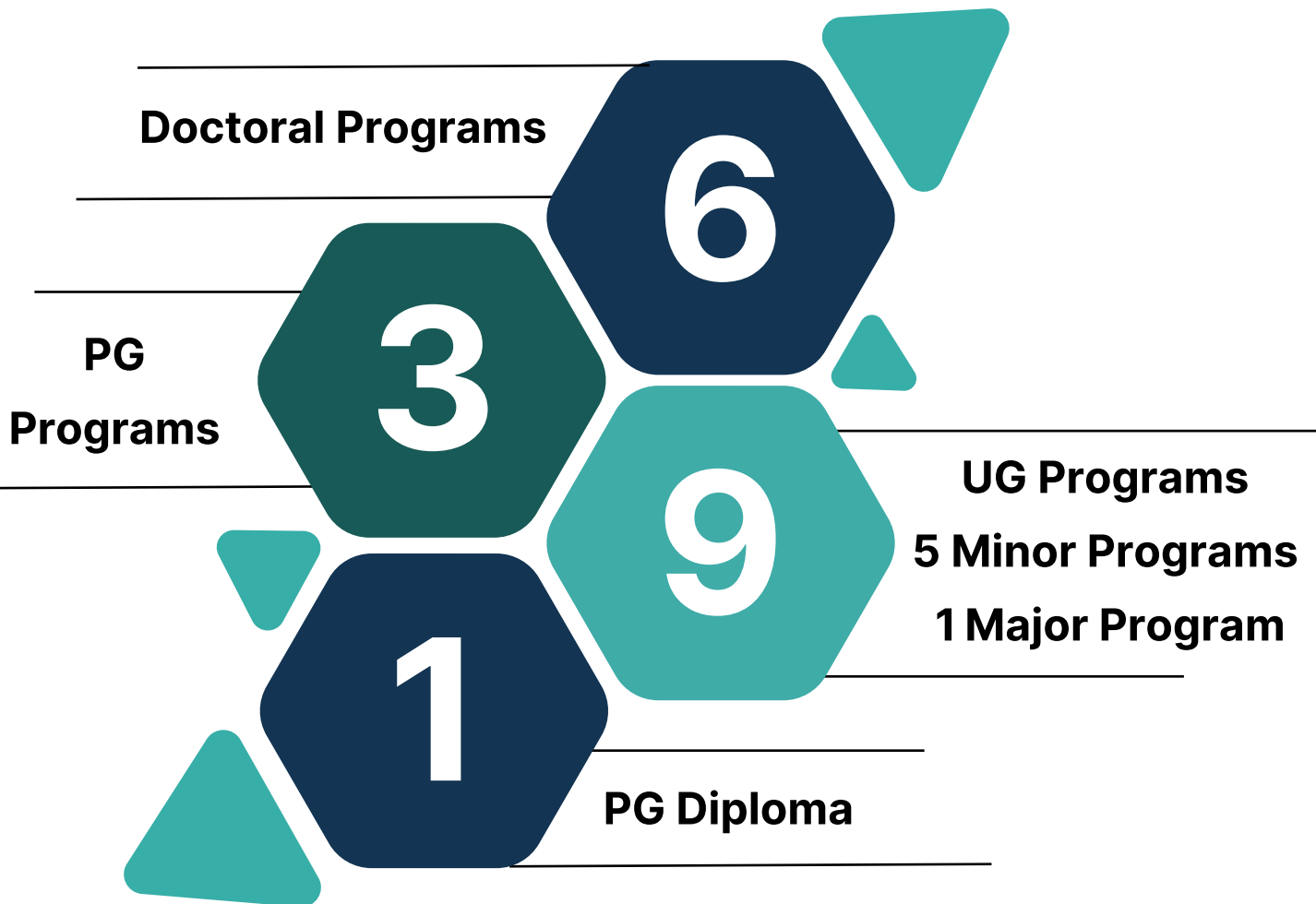

Admission Process

B.Tech. Admissions for 2026 to various programs of IIIT-Delhi will be primarily through JAC. Some seats in B.Tech. (CSD) will be filled through UCEED Ranks and some in B.Tech. (CSSS) admissions will happen through class XII marks. These will be filled through the IIIT-Delhi Admission process. Details regarding the number of seats, eligibility, merit list, and admission process are described below:

Admission through JAC

The admission to B.Tech. (CSE), B.Tech. (ECE), B.Tech. (CSAM), B.Tech. (CSB), B.Tech. (CSAI), B.Tech. (CSEcon), B.Tech. (EVE) and some seats of B.Tech. (CSD) & B.Tech. (CSSS) will be done along with Delhi Technological University (DTU), Netaji Subhash University of Technology (NSUT) (formerly NSIT), and Indira Gandhi Delhi Technical University for Women (IGDTUW). During the joint counselling, admissions will be offered to candidates in accordance with the IIIT-Delhi merit list in different categories. Detailed instructions for joint counselling will be posted on the counselling site (<https://jacdelhi.admissions.nic.in/>) from time to time.

Note:

No admissions will be done after the commencement of the classes.

Admission through IIITD Admission Process

Admission to some seats of B.Tech. (CSD) using UCEED Rank and some seats of B.Tech. (CSSS) using class XII marks will be done through the IIIT-Delhi admission process as per the details provided below. For these seats, candidates are required to fill out the online application form available on the IIIT-Delhi website: <https://iiitd.ac.in/admissions/btech/2026/>

Note: There is no relaxation in marks for EWS category candidates. Any other relaxation (if any) will be announced on the Joint Admission Counselling (JAC) website.

Merit List for Admission

Admission through JAC

- Final Percentile score obtained in Paper 1 in JEE Mains 2026 NTA score.
- Bonus point, if any, as defined in bonus points criteria 1-10 (maximum 2).
- The priority list will be based on the total of the above two.
- In the case of a tie, candidate with a higher rank in JEE Mains shall rank higher.

Admission through IIT-Delhi admission process using UCEED Rank (for some seats of B.Tech. (CSD))

- Merit List for UCEED will be prepared based on candidates UCEED Rank 2026
- In case of a tie, candidate with higher class XII percentage shall rank higher. If this does not break the tie, higher rank will be assigned to the candidate having higher percentage in Mathematics.

Admission through IIT-Delhi admission process using 12th marks (for some seats of B.Tech. (CSSS))

- Total marks obtained in best five subjects (including Mathematics) in class XII in 2026 converted to base of 100.
- Bonus point, if any, as defined in bonus points criteria 1-10 (maximum 2).
- The priority list will be based on the total of the above two.
- In the case of a tie, candidate with higher marks in Mathematics shall rank higher. If this does not break the tie, higher rank will be assigned to the candidate who is older in age.

There will be no separate category-wise rank lists. However, cut off-marks for each category will be mentioned in the rank list.

Scholarship Schemes

IIIT-Delhi offers several scholarship opportunities to support aspiring students pursuing their B.Tech education. Brief details of scholarships are highlighted below.



1 Chairman's Scholarship

Students with JEE main rank below 1000 will be awarded a scholarship equivalent to 100% of the tuition fees. Students with JEE main rank between 1000-2000 will be awarded a scholarship equivalent to 50% of the tuition fee. These students will be eligible for scholarships for all four years with additional terms & conditions.

3 IIIT-Delhi Merit cum Means Scholarship

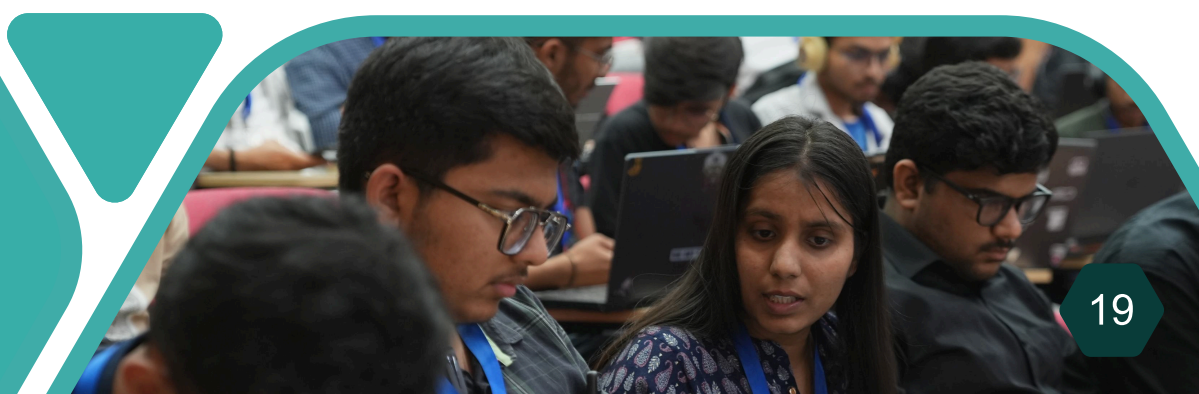
Under this scheme, students across all four years (1st to 4th year) of the B.Tech. program will be eligible for a 100% tuition fee waiver, subject to the condition that the student must be a beneficiary under the National Food Security Scheme (NFSS) and/or belong to the Below Poverty Line (BPL) category, with a valid card issued under the respective scheme.

2 Women Empowerment Scholarship in STEAM Education (WESSE)

Any female candidate who receives more than 90% aggregate marks in the XII Board Exam will be granted a scholarship equivalent to 50% of the tuition fee for all four years with additional terms & conditions.

4 IGL Scholarships

IIIT-Delhi also provides additional IGL Merit-cum-Means Scholarships for B.Tech. students which was established by Indraprastha Gas Limited in 2018. The scholarship aims to support seven meritorious B.Tech. students from economically weaker sections each year. These students are provided with a sum they can use to pay a part of their fee or buy books or other study-related material





5 Fast Retailing Sponsorship Program

IIIT-Delhi signed an MoU with Japan's Fast Retailing to offer full scholarships covering tuition and dormitory fees for a 4-year Bachelor's program, along with cultural training, internship at Uniqlo India, and job opportunities in Japan subject to fulfilling the eligibility criterias.

6 Relief Fund For Students On Humanitarian Grounds

To consider special requests of students on humanitarian grounds, the Institute Board approved to make a special provision of 50 lakhs in the Budget Estimates of the Institute for the FY 2025-26 onwards

7 Laptop Scheme: for Students from Economically Weaker Section

For Students from Economically Weaker Section: IIIT-Delhi launched a Laptop Scheme in the year 2020, through which the Institute distributes laptops to students who are from economically weaker sections so that they do not face any challenges during their studies at IIITD.

8 Kartikeya Gupta Memorial Scholarship

Parents of the late Mr. Kartikeya Gupta (B.Tech. {ECE} student of the 2018 batch) started a Kartikeya Gupta Memorial Scholarship in August 2021 for B.Tech. students. The scholarship is specifically for B.Tech. 3rd year students awarding an amount of INR 1,00,000/-

9 NAB INDIA Scholarship Scheme

The NAB India Scholarship scheme will provide the full scholarship (Annual Tuition Fee + Annual Hostel Fee + a laptop) up to a maximum of Rs. 6 lakhs per student per annum for four years, i.e., for the standard duration of the B. Tech. Program at IIIT-D. A maximum of five (5) scholarships will be awarded to the first-year B. Tech. students.

2+2 Degree Program with SUNY Albany University (State University of New York)

IIIT-Delhi and SUNY Albany (A state university of New York) have joined forces in an academic collaboration, offering a 2+2 dual degree program at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. This partnership allows IIIT-Delhi students in Computer Science and Engineering (CSE) and Electronics and Communications Engineering (ECE) to pursue a Bachelor of Science in Forensic Science at SUNY Albany. The program emphasizes collaborative research, exchange programs, and joint coursework, preparing students with interdisciplinary expertise for careers in forensic science and criminal justice.

Highlights

- 2+2 joint degree program with ten seats available for existing B.Tech. CSE and ECE students.
- Fees are split between IIIT-Delhi and SUNY Albany.
- Open to all CSE and ECE students after the 2nd semester.
- Application review after the 2nd semester selected students notified in the 3rd semester.
- Students transition to SUNY Albany after completing the required credits at IIIT-Delhi.

- Remaining credits completed at SUNY Albany.
- Degree requirements aligned between IIIT-Delhi and SUNY Albany.
- Upon completion, students receive B.Tech. from IIIT-Delhi and BS in Forensic Science from SUNY Albany.
- Three years of OPT (Optional Practical Training) available post-program completion

Transfer of Credits

IIIT-Delhi has a flexible policy that allows students to pursue academic work and courses at other reputed Universities, potentially spending up to two semesters at another University like SDU, QUT, Oulu University etc. This opportunity could provide students with valuable experiences and broaden their academic horizons.

The maximum credit transfer limit of 40 credits over the entire B.Tech. program, with a cap of 20 credits per semester, ensures students balance their home institution's requirements and external academic pursuits. This policy encourages exploration and academic enrichment while ensuring students stay on track towards their degree goals.

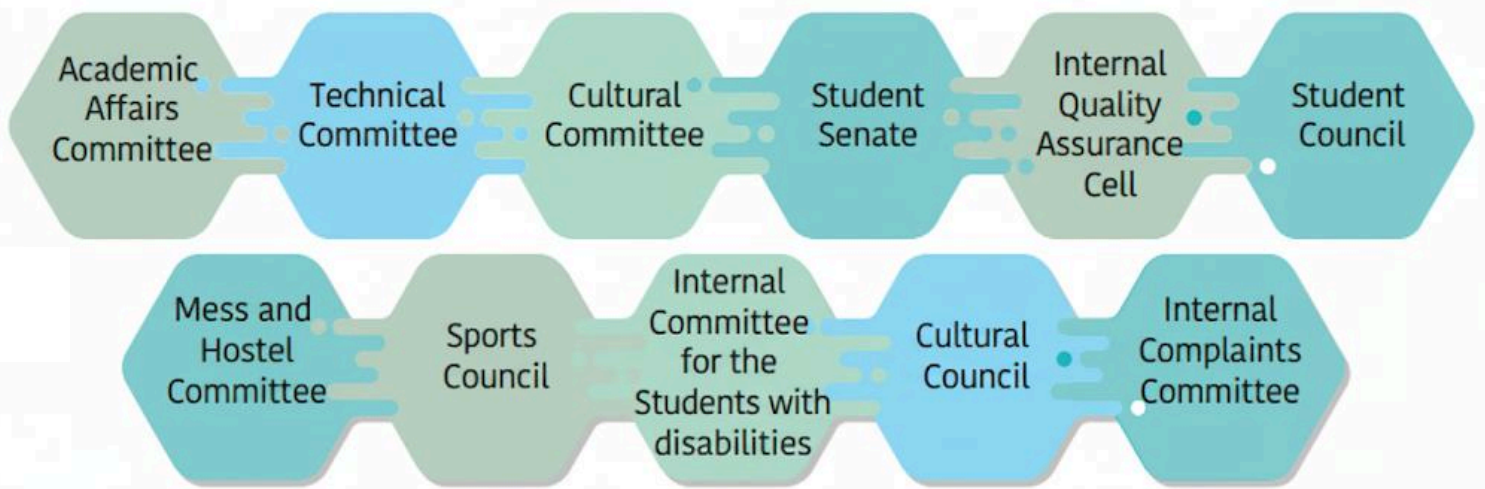

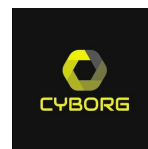
Vibrant Student Life

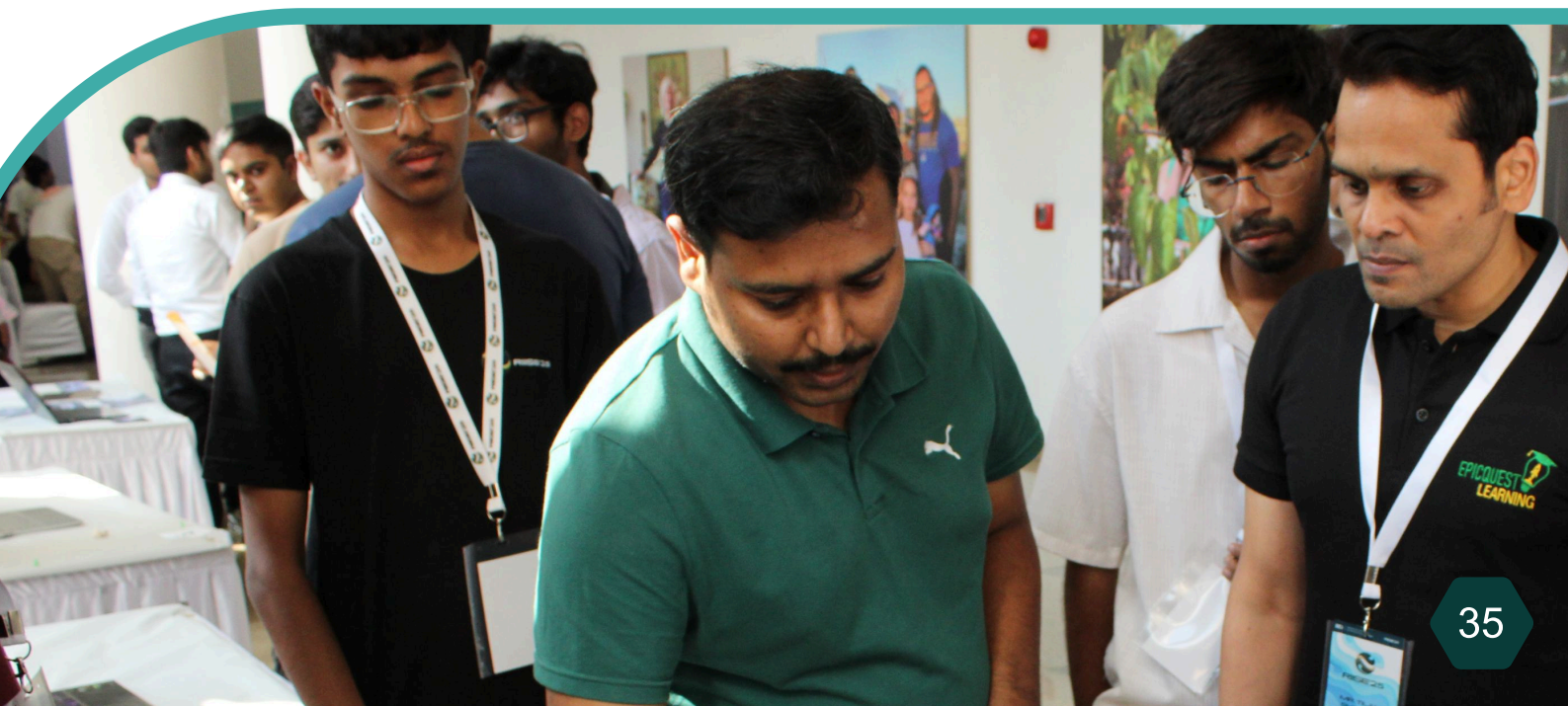


Research

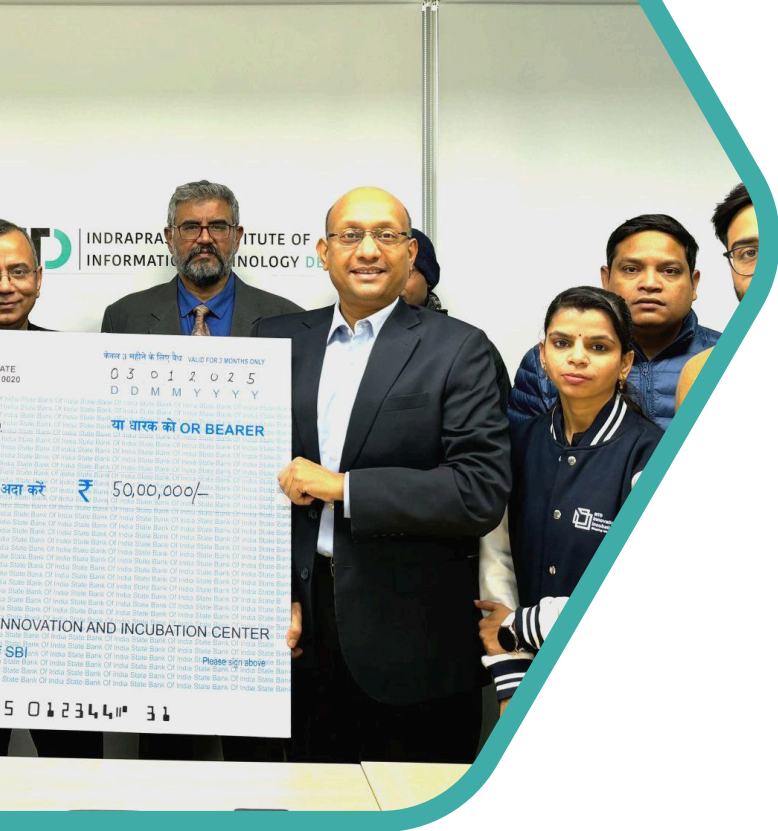

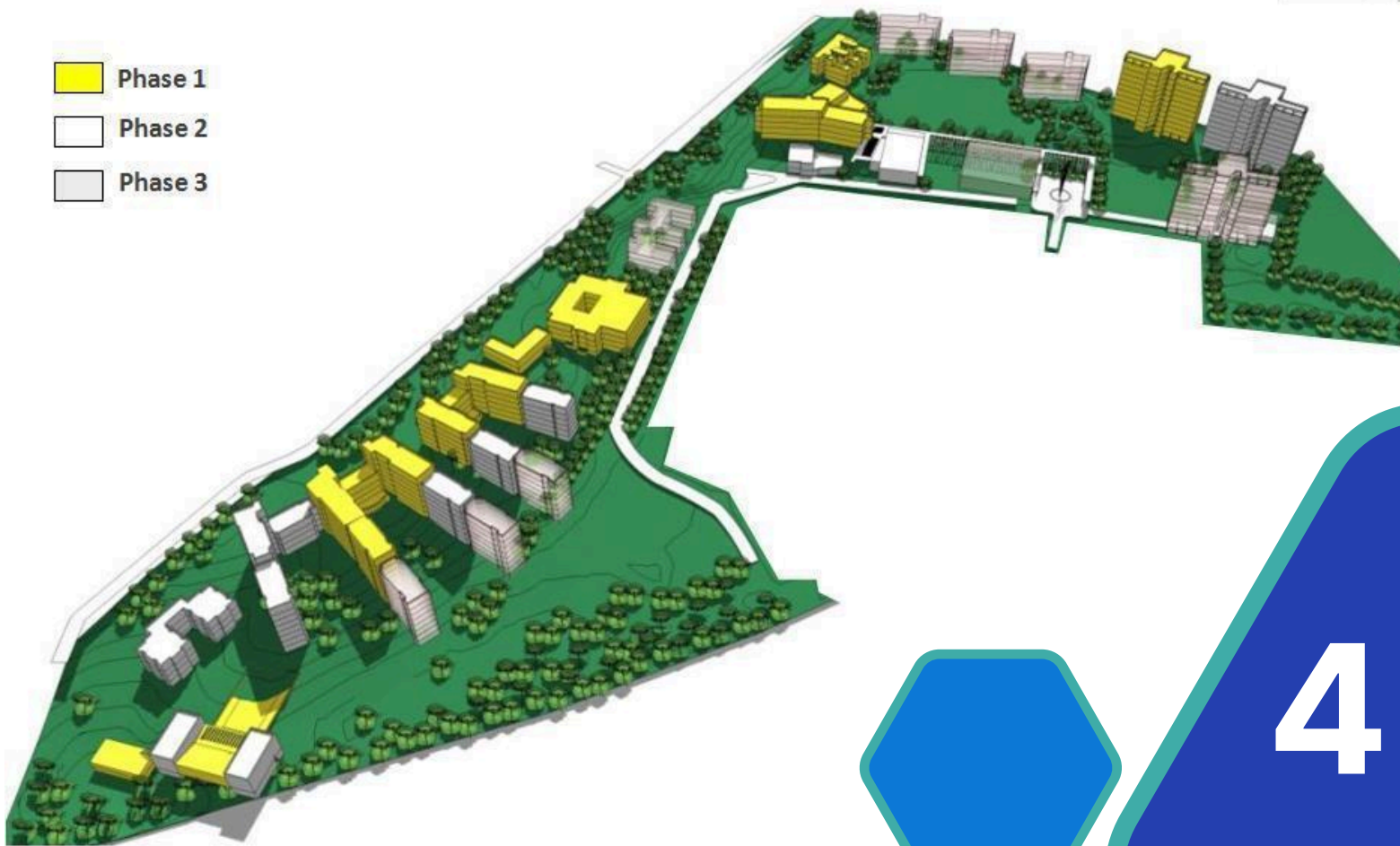
Infrastructure

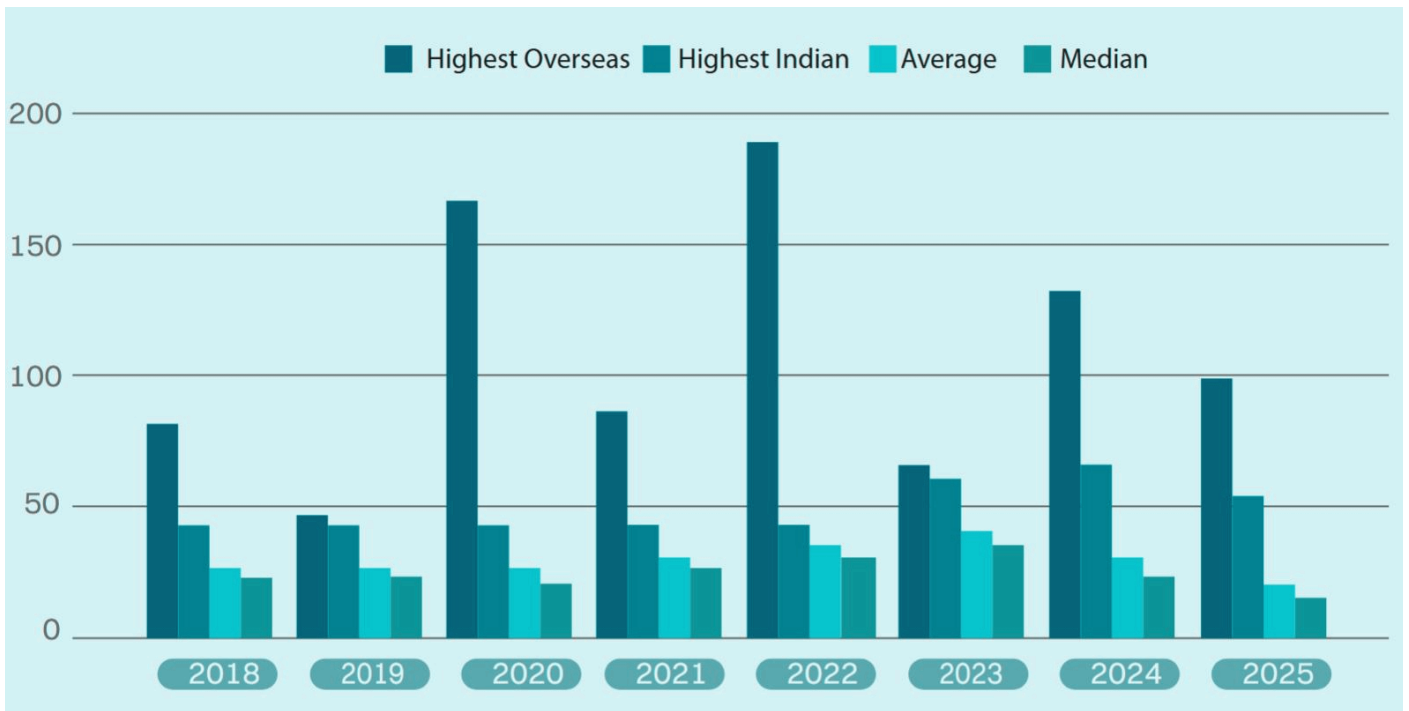

The current technological era is rich with opportunities for systems integration of technologies from various disciplines to serve the larger goals of society. Hence, IIT-Delhi aspires to provide interdisciplinary teaching, research, and learning environments. Our flexible curriculum allows students to enroll in elective courses from various disciplines like Computer Science, Design, Electronics and Communications, Entrepreneurship, Biosciences, Artificial Intelligence and Economics in the third and fourth years. The curriculum of all nine programs also includes courses in social sciences. Our engineering Programs provide the necessary depth and broad systems-centric educational experience for long-term success in emerging cutting-edge IT and engineering industries.

The first semester's curriculum is similar across all nine programs, allowing eligible students to move from one program to another. The first two years' curriculum comprises mainly core courses for the disciplines. Economically Weaker Section (EWS)

Criteria for Income and Assets

The benefits of reservation under EWS can be availed by persons who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs, and OBCs upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a competent authority based upon the following criteria:

Candidates whose family has a gross annual income below 8.0 lakh (Rupees eight lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e., salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc., for the financial year prior to the year of application.

Also, persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income.

The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.

The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks the benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years, as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years.

The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority after March 31, 2026. The Income and Asset Certificate issued by any one of the following authorities in the prescribed format as given in Annexure (placed at the end) shall only be accepted as proof of the candidate's claim as belonging to EWS.



1 5 acres of agricultural land and above



2 Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above



3 Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities



4 Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities

A candidate passing the qualifying examination from a recognized School/ College/ Institute located within the National Capital Territory (N.C.T.) of Delhi will be considered for Delhi Region only. For a candidate, who has passed the qualifying examination through Patrachar Vidyalaya, Delhi/ National Institute of Open School, Delhi (NIOS), the criterion for deciding the region shall be the location of his/her centre of examination. In other words, if the centre of examination is located in the N.C.T. of Delhi, the candidate shall be considered under the Delhi Region, and if the centre of examination is located outside N.C.T. of Delhi, he/she shall be considered under the Outside Delhi Region.

The remaining vacant seats, if any, will be allotted to Priority-II in a similar fashion, and so on.
- The reservation under the CW sub-category is available only to such candidates who fall under the listed priorities.
- It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to prove his/her eligibility for claiming reservation under any of the reserved categories/sub-categories. The candidates claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBC/EWS/KM categories, CW/PwD sub-categories will be required to produce the original certificate of the respective reserved category/sub-category issued by the competent authority (as mentioned in this information brochure) at the time of document verification. If the reserved category/sub-category certificate is not found to be in order, no benefit of the reserved category/sub-category will be given, and the provisionally allotted seat to that candidate will stand automatically cancelled. Such candidates may be considered under the General category/sub-category in the respective state quota for subsequent rounds of counselling on submission of a request in this regard.

Persons with Disabilities (PwD) Category

For admission to a seat reserved for the Persons with Disabilities (PwD) sub-category, the candidate must produce the following certificates (as per the format available at the end) in original at the time of document verification for Persons with Disabilities (PwD) candidates:

- A certificate of physical disability issued by the Competent Authority as per the provision of the Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 in the prescribed format as given under the Act.
- A suitability certificate.
- The Candidate with benchmark disabilities shall produce the medical certificate issued by the Govt. Hospitals duly notified by the Govt. of N.C.T. of Delhi/Other State government and further duly verified by the Chief Medical Officer of the concerned Government Hospital.
- A certificate, duly recommended by any of the Vocational Rehabilitation Centres for the handicapped, including Vocational Rehabilitation Centre for the handicapped, 9-11 Vikas Marg, Karkarduma, Delhi 110092, established by the Ministry of Labour and Employment.

Note:

For documents of Kashmiri Migrant (KM) and Defence Category (CW), refer to JAC Brochure.

After converting the seats as per the criteria mentioned above, in case sufficient numbers of eligible candidates are not available for admission to B.Tech. (CSD) and B.Tech. (CSSS) using UCEED Rank and Class XII score through IIIT-Delhi admission process, respectively, the vacancies may be opened for admission through JAC in the respective categories.

Certificates to be produced with respect to reserved categories

Candidates applying for any reserved seat (i.e. SC, ST, OBC-NCL, EWS, CW, Persons with Disabilities (PwD) and KM must produce the original certificates (as applicable) as mentioned below at the time of document verification.

SC/ST/OBC Candidates

For admission to a seat reserved for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Other Backward Class (NCL)/EWS, the candidate must produce a certificate, in original, issued from an approved district authority stating the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Other Backward Class (NCL)/EWS, to which the candidate belongs. A list of approved authorities is given below:

- District Magistrate / Additional Magistrate / Deputy Commissioner / Collector / Additional Deputy Commissioner / Deputy Collector / 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate), Sub-Divisional Magistrate / Taluka Magistrate / Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner
- Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar
- Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidates and/or his/her family normally resides
- Administrator/Secretary to Administration/ Development Officer (Laccadive & Minicoy Islands)



Note:

- Caste name as mentioned in the OBC Certificate MUST exactly match with the name of the caste listed at: [https://iiitd.ac.in/sites/default/files/docs/admissions/2026/obc_list_put_up %20\(2\).pdf](https://iiitd.ac.in/sites/default/files/docs/admissions/2026/obc_list_put_up%20(2).pdf)
- The candidate seeking admission under reserved categories has to mandatorily produce the caste/category certificate in his/her name at the time of counselling. The certificate in the name of either of the parents (Mother/Father) or any other family member is unacceptable, and the candidate will not be entitled even for provisional admission.
- The reservation certificate should be issued from the respective state/region in which the reservation is being claimed, e.g., in case, a candidate claims the seat reserved for the Delhi Region category, he/she has to bring SC / ST / OBC certificate issued by Govt. of N.C.T. of Delhi and should have also passed his/her qualifying examination from a School/ College / Institute located in National Capital Territory of Delhi.
- OBC (NCL) candidates are required to produce a caste certificate issued after March 31, 2026, from the authorities as mentioned above. However, if the certificate is issued prior to March 31, 2026, it must be accompanied by an additional certificate regarding the present non-creamy layer status of the candidate, issued by the same competent authority. This additional certificate must have a reference to his/her already issued original caste certificate.
- Students claiming OBC reservation under the Delhi region will be admitted in this category on the submission of a certificate to this effect from the Competent Authority of the Government of N.C.T. of Delhi. Certificates issued by Govt. of India or any state government will not be accepted under any circumstances. A certificate issued by a Competent Authority of Delhi to an individual on the basis of the Caste Certificate of his/her parents from another state will be accepted for claiming a seat under OBC Category only if the caste is in the list of notified OBC list by Govt. of N.C.T. of Delhi.

Bonus Points

Upto 2 bonus points will be given to the candidates as mentioned below. For all these, official supporting documents (letters, certificates etc.) will have to be provided. IIT-Delhi will also directly verify it from the organizers.

Note: If a candidate qualifies for multiple bonus categories, they will receive the points from the single category that awards the highest score among all qualifying categories.

1. Olympiad

Indian National Olympiad in Informatics, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Astronomy, and Biology Olympiads

2 bonus points if the student was selected for the summer training camp for the selection of the final team for the International Olympiad (i.e. IOITC, IMOTC, OCSC for Physics, Chemistry, Astronomy, or Biology). Supporting documents required: Certificate/Letter from organizers

1 bonus point, if the student qualified to appear in the National Level Exam for selection for the summer camp (i.e. INOI/INMO/INPhO/INChO/INAO/INBO). Supporting documents required: Qualification Letter/Email to appear in the exam.

Note: Those who qualified to appear in INOI through ZCO-2025 will not be eligible for the bonus points, and those who have been declared deemed to have qualified through ZCO 2026 will be eligible.

2. Procon Junior Programming Contest

2 bonus points for the medal winners; Supporting documents needed: Certificate/Letter certifying this.

1 bonus point for those who got certificates of Achievement. Supporting documents needed: Certificate/Letter from organizers certifying this.

3. National Talent Search Examination Scholarship

1 bonus point, if a student has won this scholarship. If a student obtains a scholarship in a specific category, then he/she can only be considered for admission in that category. Supporting documents needed: Certificate/Grant Letter.

4. INSPIRE Program of DST

2 bonus points, if a student is a recipient of Gold /Silver /Bronze /Consolation Award in NLEPC. Supporting documents needed: Official Certificate for the award from DST.

1 bonus point if the student has qualified for participation in the National Level Exhibition and Project Competition (NLEPC). Supporting documents needed: Official participation Certificate from DST.

5. IGNITE Award of National Innovation Foundation

2 bonus points, if the student is a recipient of the National IGNITE Award. Supporting documents needed: Official Certificate for the award from NIF.

6. IRIS National Science Fair

2 bonus points, if the student is a recipient of the award for participation in the International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF).

1 bonus point, if the student was selected for the National Fair. Supporting documents needed: Official Certificate for the award from IRIS.

7. Sports

In any sport in “high priority and priority discipline: (as per the terminology announced on IIT-Delhi Website), except Chess (as Chess is dealt with separately): If a student has represented a state in (i) National School Games organized by a School Games Federation of India, in U19 or U17 category, or (ii) National Championship organized by a National Sports Federation in Senior/Junior category

1 bonus point for participation or winning a medal. Supporting documents needed: Certificate for the medal or Certificate of participation issued by the School Games Federation of India or by a National Sports Federation.

8. Chess

2 bonus points for those whose FIDE rating is above 1,800. Supporting documents needed: FIDE ID, a Self-attested printout of the list of International-rated tournaments played as provided by FIDE through their official website.

1 bonus point for those whose FIDE rating is between 1,200 and 1,800. Supporting documents needed: Same as above.

Note: FIDE rating will be verified online from the FIDE website at the time of document verification.

9. Culture

1 Bonus point for those students who have received “Scholarship to Young Artistes” given by the Ministry of Culture, Government of India, or “Cultural Talent Search Scholarship Scheme” given by the Centre for Cultural Resources and Training, an autonomous body under the aegis of Ministry of Culture, Government of India. Supporting documents needed: Scholarship sanction letter and certificate issued by Ministry of Culture, Government of India / Centre for Cultural Resources and Training, Government of India.

10. Class XII Marks (for Girl Candidates only)

1 Bonus point for girl candidates scoring 90% & above in aggregate with 95% and above in PCM (Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics) subjects in class XII board exams.
