Football Women was claimed by the team led by Anisha Bopardikar, composed of players from CSE, CSB, and CSD. In Basketball Men, ECE/EVE's Abdullah Shujat captained his team to 1st place, followed by MTech's Ashutosh in 2nd and CSE's Akshat Saxena in 3rd. Basketball Women saw CSE's Divyanshi lead her team to 1st place, with CSD's Anika in 2nd. In Volleyball, CSAM's Hitesh Kumar captained the winning team, followed by CSE's Rishi Dahiya in 2nd and ECE/EVE's Nootan Sharma in 3rd. Badminton had CSE's Richa Muktibodh take the 1st place, with CSAM/CSD's Ishita in 2nd. Table Tennis saw Mandeep Singh Pruthi from CSB/CSD win 1st, Anant Bhaskar from CSAI/EVE in 2nd, and CSE's Dhruv Jain in 3rd. Male Shotput was won by CSE's Aman Sharma, with CSAI's Sahitya in 2nd and ECE's Om Kumar Gupta in 3rd. Broad Jump Men saw CSE's Ayaan Hasan take 1st, CSAM's Priyanshu Rana in 2nd, and CSE's Aman Sharma in 3rd. Pool had Tushar Kumar from ECE + CSAI winning 1st, with CSAI's Divya Raj Singh in 2nd and CSD + CSB's Abhinav Arora in 3rd. Lawn Tennis saw CSAI's Ishwar Babu claim 1st, CSSS's Parth Goyal in 2nd, and CSE + CSB's Pranav Bharadwaj in 3rd. Foosball was won by ECE's Aviral Keshari in 1st, CSAM's Mahir Yadav in 2nd, and CSD's Harsh Pal in 3rd. In Shuttle Race Men, CSB's Shubham Khokhar won 1st, followed by CSB's Dhruv Peshin in 2nd and EVE's Mayank in 3rd.
