

Health Camp with Quantum Resonance Magnetic Analysis

On October 16th, 2024, a Health Camp will be organized in our institute, offering an exciting opportunity for students and staff to gain insights into their physical well-being. The camp, hosted at the H1 common room from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm, will feature the Japanese Quantum Resonance Magnetic Analyzer (QRMA), a groundbreaking non-invasive health assessment tool. Unlike traditional methods. QRMA scans the body's bioelectromagnetic field, offering a holistic health analysis without invasive procedures. This advanced technology is particularly beneficial in detecting potential health issues early by highlighting imbalances within the body. Attendees can expect comprehensive reports on various aspects of their well-being, encouraging preventive care and proactive health management.

Women in Tech Club: Empowering Women, Inspiring Change



Unleash your creativity this Vigilance Week




